

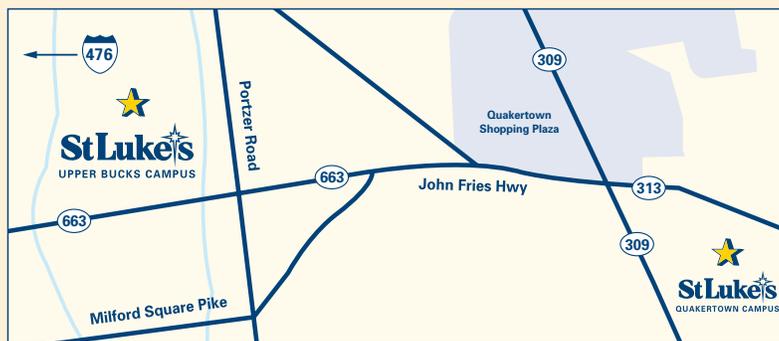


# St. Luke's Upper Bucks Campus

## Get to Know Our New Campus

St. Luke's, the region's largest, most established health system and one of the nation's 100 Top Hospitals, is building its newest campus set in beautiful Upper Bucks County.

Located on a 38-acre parcel of land on the corner of Route 663 and Portzer Road in Milford Township, St. Luke's Upper Bucks Campus is only a 5-minute drive from downtown Quakertown to the east and 3 miles to the Pennsylvania Turnpike to the west. It is easily accessible by major road systems in the area – Route 309, Route 313 and Interstate 476.



St. Luke's Upper Bucks Campus will be the newest hospital construction project in Bucks County since 1973; and with a \$100 million investment, the largest project in Quakertown's history. It will offer patients easy access to specialists, outstanding physicians, advanced technology, nationally recognized health care and top-notch customer service. St. Luke's Upper Bucks Campus will provide medical, diagnostic, critical care, emergency and surgical services.

### Expanding to Meet Your Needs:

- Emergency Room – Sixteen bays
- Second floor – Twenty Medical Surgical beds (additional space to meet future needs)
- Third floor – Thirty Medical Surgical beds, Ten Intensive Care Unit beds

### Operating Rooms / Procedure Units:

- Four operating rooms and one procedure room
- Interventional Radiology

## Building for a Healthier Tomorrow

- St. Luke's Upper Bucks Campus will be a patient and family-friendly modern hospital, offering comprehensive care and advanced technology to area residents. The 131,000 square-foot facility is scheduled for completion in Fall 2019.
- The hospital will have the region's only fully accredited Level 4 Trauma Center and designated Center of Excellence in Hernia Surgery.
- The new hospital will include spacious, private rooms, a large emergency room, four operating rooms, state-of-the-art Interventional Radiology lab, diagnostic radiology and additional lab services. Over time, the campus will grow with expanded inpatient services and physician offices.
- Thoughtful accessibility for patients and families is our priority and is reflected in the design of the new hospital. The layout includes registration, diagnostic testing, cafeteria and elevators within steps of entering the main lobby.
- The project is utilizing 100% American steel, is employing 200 construction workers through more than 25 contractors, and will sustain hundreds of permanent, family-supporting jobs.

The Emergency Room at the Quakertown Campus will relocate to the Upper Bucks Campus upon its opening.
